The 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF) is awarded by 1st4sport Qualifications and has been developed in partnership with the UK Angling Source Group.

Is the 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF) for me?

If you are over 17 years of age:

- with some experience of angling in at least one context (game, sea, coarse)
- hold a recognised coaching or teaching qualification at Level 1 or above

and

- would like to develop and improve your coaching skills

...then the 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF) is designed for you.

Why should I study the 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF)?

It forms part of a structured and progressive programme of sports coaching and other related qualifications, offering you access and involvement in introducing others to the sport of angling.

What can I use the 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF) for?

- To gain paid or unpaid employment as an angling coach.
- As part of the development of a credible CV for employment in the sport, recreation and allied occupations industry.

What will I learn?

Your learning programme will develop your understanding of:

- the role of a coach
- the coaching process
- participants' learning styles
- behaviour management
- how to reflect on a coaching session
- the principles of planning coaching sessions
- the principles of skill development through coaching sessions
- how the stages of participants' development impacts on their coaching
- the principles of evaluation in coaching
- basic nutrition and hydration principles for sports performance
- physical conditioning for sport
- principles of mental preparation in sport
- how to support participant awareness of drugs in sport
- how to ensure participants' safety during sport-specific coaching sessions
- how to ensure equitable coaching of sport-specific activities
- reviewing participants' needs for a series of angling coaching sessions
- producing a series of angling coaching session plans
- planning the evaluation of a series of angling coaching sessions
- preparing resources for angling coaching sessions
- assessing and minimising risks before the angling session
- establishing and maintaining working relationships
- safeguarding and protecting children and vulnerable adults
- preparing participants for angling coaching sessions
- delivering angling coaching sessions
- developing participants' performance
- concluding angling coaching sessions
- evaluating participant performance
- evaluating angling coaching sessions
- evaluating and developing your angling coaching practice.

How will my learning programme be structured?

Learning programmes are usually designed by the recognised centre that delivers the qualification. They may, therefore, vary in length and format. Depending on your needs, delivery centres can offer intensive courses or a series of learning events over a period of weeks. Whatever the timescale, all learning programmes should include the following phases:

- an induction to the qualification and your programme of learning and assessment
- a learning programme that meets your needs, focusing on the theory and practice of coaching angling
- a programme of assessment, spread throughout the course, including observations of your coaching by an appropriately qualified assessor.

At the end of the programme, you will be provided with formal feedback on your performance and an action plan for your further development.

What will my assessment involve?

The 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Angling (QCF) assessment will require you to:

- have an appropriate understanding of the Level 2 knowledge units and the specific technical knowledge underpinning the coaching of angling, which will be assessed via performance, simulation, tasks and assignments
- produce a linked session planner for a series of six angling coaching sessions. The series of sessions must be drawn from the Level 2 Angling Technical Syllabus and demonstrate a distinct progression appropriate to the needs of the participants
- produce individual session plans for each of the angling coaching sessions
- produce a written risk assessment for each coaching venue used during the coaching of the above sessions
- produce an evaluation schedule for the above sessions that identifies the evaluation methods that will be used and when feedback will be sought and from whom
- produce a written evaluation of each of the above sessions
- produce a summary log outlining the delivery of the above sessions. Sessions should be at least 60 minutes in length. Delivery of these sessions should be witnessed by an appropriate person
- be observed delivering two angling coaching sessions by an appropriately qualified assessor. This session may be simulated and delivered on the course of training. An individual session plan, risk assessment and evaluation should be produced for the session
- produce a written coach assessment and personal development action plan.

How much will the qualification cost me?

Recognised centres offering this qualification determine their own fees and they will vary from centre to centre. The fees charged should entitle you to a programme of learning and assessment, registration and certification for the qualification, a 1st4sport Qualifications Learner Pack and an appropriate learning resource. For further information on the costs of courses, please contact a recognised centre.

Opportunities for funding may be available via a recognised centre, if you are eligible.

What do I do next?

The qualification is delivered by 1st4sport Qualifications' recognised centres, not all of which offer open courses to members of the public. Your first port of call to access a course should be the appropriate national governing body of sport.
