Qualification Objective
What does this qualification cover?
This qualification develops learners' skills and knowledge required to transport horses safely and legally on short journeys over 65km (40 miles) but not exceeding 8 hours.
Who is the qualification for?
This qualification is designed for individuals who already work with horses or are wishing to work with horses and want to gain a qualification to enable them to transport horses on short journeys over 65km (40 miles) but not exceeding 8 hours.

Learners could progress onto additional CPD opportunities offered through industry specific organisations.
What future employment could this qualification lead to?
Successful learners will be able to progress to Attendant / Driver roles for short journeys.
Qualification Achievement
Entry Requirements for the Qualification
Prior to registration learners are required to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have been accurately identified • be at least 16 years of age • able to communicate effectively in English (listening, speaking, reading and writing). <p>There are no additional prerequisites to certification other than the successful completion of the required assessments</p>

How is the Qualification Achieved?						
Achievement of this qualification is normally through attendance on a structure programme of learning and assessment.						
What will be assessed?						
This qualification is assessed through a Multiple Choice test set externally by 1st4sport Qualifications consisting of 50 questions. Learners will have one hour to complete their test and must achieve a minimum of 70% in the paper to pass.						
How will it be assessed?						
This qualification contains a range of units to be completed by the learner. Each unit is comprised of a number of learning outcomes and identified assessment criteria to be completed.						
Learning Outcomes that begin 'The learner will understand... ' will be assessed through theory based activities.						
Learning Outcomes that begin 'The learner will be able to... ' are assessed through practical activities.

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Qualification Delivery

What workforce is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?

The recognised centre is required to have a qualified and competent qualification workforce in place which includes as a minimum.

- a qualification administrator
- a qualification coordinator
- a BHA-approved assessor
- a BHA-approved internal quality assurer (IQA)

What facilities are needed to be able to deliver this qualification?

The recognised centre is required to have one or more delivery sites which contain facilities to support the programme of learning and assessment. These must comply with *Health and Safety in the Racing and Breeding Industry* and have in place appropriate access arrangements. All training and/or assessment sites must include the following facilities:

- A practical space to be used for learning and assessment activities
- A theory space which may include a classroom. This must contain multimedia facilities such as data projector and laptop, flip chart and pens.
- Examination facilities. These must have:
 - minimum levels of outside noise
 - no display material that may aid learners
 - a reliable clock. Where two or more clocks exist, these must display the same time
 - centre number and start and finish times of the exam clearly on display for learners.
 - seating arranged in a manner to prevent learners overlooking fellow learners, ideally on separate desks
 - signs displayed to alert others to an exam in progress

What equipment is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?

The recognised centre is required to have equipment in place to facilitate the full programme of assessment which must comply with *The Health and Safety at Work Act (1974)* and other directives.

The recognised centre is required to ensure that all learners wear appropriate apparel for the tasks they undertake.

What qualification materials support this qualification?

This qualification is supported by a number of additional documents which must be read by all relevant personnel within recognised centres approved to offer this qualification. These include the *1st4sport Level 3 Award in the Principles of Transporting Horses by Road on Short Journeys*:

- *Qualification Manual*, detailing the 1st4sport Qualification Approval Conditions and the Delivery, Assessment and Quality Assurance Approach for this qualification
- *Unit Specifications*, detailing the Learning Outcomes and Assessment criteria for the qualification
