<p><b>What does this qualification cover?</b></p> <p>This qualification is designed to provide learners with an introduction to teaching/training in the further education and skills sector. It has been developed as an introduction to teaching qualification for learners who do not require the larger industry standard <i>introduction to teaching qualification</i>, the <i>1st4sport Level 3 Award in Education and Training</i>. It is a knowledge-based teaching qualification which has no minimum teaching practice requirement, and therefore, it may be undertaken by individuals who are not currently in a teaching role. However, there is a minimum requirement to take part in microteaching. The qualification is composed of one mandatory unit.</p>
<p><b>Who is the qualification for?</b></p> <p>The qualification is designed for those aspiring to teach or new to teaching in the further education and skills sector.</p>
<p><b>Who supports this qualification?</b></p> <p>The qualification is recognised by UK Coaching for tutors delivering Sports Coach Education.</p>

<p><b>What future education could this qualification lead to?</b></p> <p>Holders of this qualification can progress to the <i>Level 3 Award in Education and Training</i>, <i>Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training</i>, or the <i>Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training</i> or other higher level teaching qualifications depending upon the role and associated teaching responsibilities.</p>
<p><b>What future employment could this qualification lead to?</b></p> <p>Learners are able to teach sports coach education, where applicable.</p>

Qualification Achievement
<p><b>Entry Requirements for the Qualification</b></p> <p>Prior to registration learners are required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• be accurately identified</li> <li>• be 18 years of age or over</li> <li>• be able to communicate effectively in English (this includes listening, speaking, reading and writing).</li> </ul>
<p><b>How is the Qualification Achieved?</b></p> <p>Achievement of the qualification is normally through a programme of learning and assessment, which ensures completion of the <i>1st4sport Learner Portfolio</i> inclusive of all assessed tasks</p>
<p><b>What will be assessed?</b></p> <p>Learners must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• complete a 30-minute (minimum) teaching/ microteaching session that is observed and assessed by an appropriately qualified assessor.</li> <li>• observe and review a 30 minute micro-teaching/ teaching session of another trainee tutor or experienced tutor/ teacher.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How will it be assessed?</b></p> <p>This qualification contains a range of units to be completed by the learner. Each unit is comprised of a number of learning outcomes and identified assessment criteria to be completed.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will <b>understand...</b>’ will be assessed through theory based activities.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will <b>be able to...</b>’ are assessed through practical activities.</p> <p>For example:</p>

<p>The recognised centre is required to have a qualified and competent qualification workforce in place which includes as a minimum.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a qualification administrator</li> <li>• a qualification coordinator</li> <li>• an appropriately qualified tutor</li> <li>• an appropriately qualified assessor</li> <li>• an appropriately qualified internal quality assurer (IQA)</li> </ul> <p>Further information on workforce requirements are available from 1st4sport Qualifications on request.</p>	

<b>What facilities are needed to be able to deliver this qualification?</b>
<p>The recognised centre is required to have one or more delivery sites which contain facilities to support the programme of learning and assessment. These must comply with accepted health and safety practices for and have in place appropriate access arrangements. All training and/or assessment sites must include the following facilities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a suitable classroom facility/ lecture room</li> <li>• an appropriate room/environment is available to carry out teaching/micro teaching assessments.</li> </ul> <p>The environment must be conducive to learning; lighting, temperature and noise levels appropriate to learner needs.</p>
<b>What equipment is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?</b>
<p>The recognised centre is required to have equipment in place to facilitate the full programme of learning and assessment which must comply with accepted health and safety practice and must include:</p> <p>Learners have access to a range of the following teaching resources:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• power point projector</li> <li>• interactive white board</li> <li>• white board and pens</li> <li>• flip chart and pens</li> <li>• computer</li> <li>• TV and DVD facilities</li> <li>• internet</li> </ul>
