Qualification Objective
What does this qualification cover?
This qualification is designed to provide qualified and experienced assessors with a qualification to confirm competency in end-point assessment practice in order to allow them to practice as an Independent End-Point Assessor of learners' knowledge and skills in relation to apprenticeship standards.
Who is the qualification for?
This qualification is designed for qualified and experienced assessors who are aiming to become Independent End-Point Assessors of apprenticeship standards. Learners must be able to demonstrate the industry experience specified in the assessment plan of each standard they are deployed to end-point assess.
Who supports this qualification?
This qualification is supported by British Horseracing Association, the National Governing Body for horseracing, who are committed to the quality of apprenticeship training within their sector and Northern Racing College who are actively involved in providing apprenticeship training.
Qualification Progression
What future education could this qualification lead to?
Qualification progression may include the Level 4 Award in Internal Quality Assurance of Assessment Processes and Practices.

Successful learners will be qualified to seek employment in appropriate paid or voluntary end-point assessment roles within their specialist subject area.

How is the Qualification Achieved?
Achievement of the qualification is normally through a programme of learning and work-based assessment, which ensures completion of the 1st4sport Learner Portfolio inclusive of all assessed tasks.
What will be assessed?
<p>To achieve the qualification, learners are required to have, in summary, assessed evidence of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an appropriate knowledge and understanding of end-point assessment practices, which will be assessed via written tasks and assignments.

How will it be assessed?

This qualification contains a range of units to be completed by the learner. Each unit is comprised of a number of learning outcomes and identified assessment criteria to be completed.

Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will **understand...**’ will be assessed through theory based activities.

Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will **be able to...**’ are assessed through practical activities.

Qualification Delivery

What workforce is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?

The recognised centre is required to have a qualified and competent qualification workforce in place which includes as a minimum.

- a qualification administrator
- a qualification coordinator
- an appropriately qualified tutor, who holds one of the following:
 - *Level 3 Award in Education and Training; Level 3/4 Award in Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector (PTLLS); 1st4sport Level 3 Award in Delivering Learning; or 1st4sport Level 3 Award in Education and Training; Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training; Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training; Level 3/4 Certificate in Teaching in the Lifelong Learning Sector (CTLLS); Level 5 Diploma in Teaching in the Lifelong Learning Sector (DTLLS); Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).*
- an appropriately qualified assessor, who holds one of the following:
 - *Level 3 Award in Assessing Competence in the Work Environment; Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement; D32 Assess candidate performance and D33 Assess candidate using differing sources of evidence*
- an appropriately qualified internal quality assurer (IQA), who holds one of the following:
 - *Level 4 Award in Internal Quality Assurance of Assessment Processes and Practice; Level 4 Certificate in Leading the Internal Quality Assurance of Assessment Processes and Practice; 1st4sport Level 3 Certificate in Internal Verification Practice in Sport (CIVPS); V1 Conduct internal quality assurance of the assessment process*

What facilities are needed to be able to deliver this qualification?

The recognised centre is required to have one or more delivery sites which contain facilities to support the programme of learning and assessment. These must comply with accepted health and safety practices and have in place appropriate access arrangements. All training and/or assessment sites must include the following facilities:

- a suitable classroom facility/ lecture room

The environment must be conducive to learning; lighting, temperature and noise levels appropriate to learner needs.
