## Qualification Specification

<b>Qualification Overview:</b>	The 1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching (Korfball) focuses on the skills and competences required to be able to plan, deliver and review a series of linked and progressive korfball coaching sessions, working independently or as part of a coaching team.

Qualification Objective
What does this qualification cover?
This qualification prepares learners for employment as a korfbal coach. A level 2 coach is able to plan, deliver and review korfbal coaching sessions, either working independently or as part of a larger coaching team. The qualification introduces learners to the practical and theoretical aspects of planning, delivering and evaluating linked and progressive coaching sessions in korfbal.
Who is the qualification for?
The qualification is designed for those who wish to become involved in coaching korfbal, and to have responsibility for the planning, delivery and evaluation of linked and progressive coaching sessions. It is directed at learners who have an interest in coaching korfbal.
Who supports this qualification?
The qualification is recognised as the industry standard Level 2 Korfbal qualification for coaches by UK Coaching and England Korfbal. It is aligned to the Chartered Institute for the Management of Sport and Physical Activity (CIMSPA) professional standard for Coach.
Qualification Progression
What could this qualification lead to?
Learners could progress on to the <i>1st4sport Level 3 Certificate in Coaching (Sport and Physical Activity)</i> . The skills and knowledge developed through this qualification may also be used to progress to other industry-relevant qualifications in coaching sport, activity leadership, supporting PE in school sport or sports development

Qualification Achievement
Entry Requirements for the Qualification
The recognised centre is required to conduct an initial assessment of learners to ensure that pre-requisites to registration and certification are considered and that the learner has the potential to achieve the qualification.
Prior to registration learners are required to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• be accurately identified</li> <li>• be at least 18 years of age (but must be 18 years to coach independently)</li> <li>• be able to communicate effectively in English (this includes listening, speaking, reading and writing).</li> <li>• have successfully completed one of the following course               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- British Korfbal Association (BKA) Level 1 Award or above</li> <li>- International Korfbal Federation (IKF) Level 1 Award</li> <li>- England Korfbal Teaching Children Korfbal course</li> <li>- England Korfbal (EK) Level 1 Award or above</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
There are no other pre-requisites to certification other than successful completion of all learning outcomes and assessment criteria.
How is the Qualification Achieved?
To achieve the <i>1st4sport Level 2 Certificate Coaching (Korfbal)</i> , learners must successfully achieve five units: four mandatory units and the korfbal-specific pathway unit. Achievement of the qualification is normally through attendance on a programme of learning and the successful completion of the assessment tasks contained within the 1st4sport Learner Portfolio.

What will be assessed?	
<p>Learners must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>complete written tasks contained within the 1st4sport Learner Portfolio</li> <li>demonstrate their ability to plan, deliver and evaluate coaching sessions</li> </ul>	
How will it be assessed?	
<p>This qualification contains a range of units to be completed by the learner. Each unit is comprised of a number of learning outcomes and identified assessment criteria to be completed.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will <b>understand...</b>’ will be assessed through theory based activities.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes that begin ‘The learner will <b>be able to...</b>’ are assessed through practical activities.</p> <p>For example:</p>

Qualification Delivery
What workforce is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?
<p>The recognised centre is required to have a qualified and competent qualification workforce in place which includes as a minimum.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a qualification administrator</li> <li>a qualification coordinator</li> <li>an appropriately qualified tutor/assessor:</li> <li>an appropriately qualified internal quality assurer (IQA)</li> </ul> <p>Further information on workforce requirements are available from 1st4sport Qualifications on request.</p>
What facilities are needed to be able to deliver this qualification?
<p>The recognised centre is required to have one or more delivery sites which contain facilities to support the programme of training and assessment. These must comply with accepted health and safety practices for korfball and have in place appropriate access arrangements. All delivery sites must include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a practical space for korfball activities to be delivered.</li> <li>a space for theoretical sessions to be delivered with conditions conducive to learning</li> <li>toilet facilities.</li> </ul>
What equipment is needed to be able to deliver this qualification?
<p>The recognised centre is required to have equipment in place to facilitate the full programme of learning and assessment which must comply with accepted health and safety practice for korfball and must include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a selection of IKF approved korfballs – minimum of one between two learners</li> <li>a minimum of 4 korfball posts with IKF-approved baskets</li> <li>flip chart and a selection of coloured pens</li> <li>an overhead projector and a laptop/computer or equivalent</li> </ul>

What qualification materials support this qualification?
<p>This qualification is supported by a number of additional documents which must be read by all relevant personnel within recognised centres offering this qualification. Which include the <i>1st4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching (Korfball)</i>;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Qualification Handbook</i>, detailing the 1st4sport Qualification Approval Conditions (available via The Centre Portal)</li> <li>• <i>Unit Specifications</i>, detailing the Learning Outcomes and Assessment criteria for the qualification available upon qualification approval being confirmed)</li> <li>• <i>Learner Portfolio</i>, containing a series of pre-standardised assessment tools and templates to support the learner's achievement of the qualification.</li> <li>• <i>Delivery, Assessment and Quality Assurance Approach</i>, detailing the recommended learning programme, exemplar assessment answers and levels of attainment and guidance to internal quality assurance</li> </ul>
